Beverly Hills, CA private investigator Tom Grant, a 49-year-old grandfather of seven and sevenyear vetoran of the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department, hardly fails into the demographic of the average Nirvana fan' So it's nor surprising that when, on Easter Sunday, April 3, 1994. Grant was about to embark on a road of deception, incigue and cover-ups that would lead him, nine monifis later, to a stunning conclusion regarding the death of Kurt Cobain, who was found dead in Seattle on April 8, 1994.

Grank's first clues that all was not right came during his meeting with Love later that day at the Peninsula Horel in Beverly Hills, where she was staying. "She told me on the phone that someone was using her husband's credit card and she wanted to find out who It was," recounts Grant. Cobain, at the time, was AWOL from the Exodus Recovery Center, a drug refsab clinic in nearby Marina del Rey. Working on Love's suggestion that Kurr "may have gone to Seattle." Grant subcontracted local investigators to do surveillance on Cobain's known hourts in Seattle. What Love neglected to tell Grant was that Michoel "Call" DeWirt, the couple's namy, had seen Cobain at their house on Lake Washington Boulevard on April Judy day



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before she hired the PL Given Grant's assertion that Cobain died Tate Sunday morning [April 3] or early Monday morning [April 4]," this ornission may have caused a fatal-and possibly deliberate-releavin his investigation.

Grant arrived in Seattle at 11:30 PM on Wednesday. April 6. Dylan Carlson, a close friend of Cobatn's who from all reports was the singer's drug-bit/ddy, took him to the house. It was raining as they searched the house at 2:15 AH on April 7. But the garage/greenhouse a sone's throw away from the main house remained unexplored Carlson failed to direct him to the greenhouse. Later telling Grant that "it's just a dirty little room,"

The greenhouse was a L9-foot by 23-foot room above the garage. The scene that unfolded there on the morning of April 8, when an electrician noticed a body bing on the floor at 8:30 AM, could hardly be viewed as arbitrary to 1 the outside world. Cobain, who had a predisposhlon toward suicide (with pirhaps one attempt already under his belt-the overdose on Rohypnol in Rome on March 4, 1994), was discovered with a Remington M-L1 20-gauge shotgun resting on his chest and blood exading from his ear. A single charge had entered through the roof of his mouth and lodged in his head. A kiss-off note lay nearby: A nearer example of suicide would be hard to find. It he knew and digin't know about the Kurt case.

Disregarding the Seattle police department's report in the Seattle Times on May 11 that stated "there's been no foul play-just an early death that no one could explain." Gram reached his own dramark conclusion eight months later. "A conspiracy resulted in the murder of Kurt Cobain."

The scenarioù according to Grant, goes like this: Kurt was planning to divorce Courney and simultaneously leave the music business. He had spoken to Rosernary Carroll, one of the couple's attorneys about having Courtney taken out of his will. The note found with Cobain's body. Grant assens, was a farewell to his fans, not a suicide note. "It was not addressed to Frances (his daughter) and Courney, as the police report claims, and it doesn't say anything in there about suicide," says Grant.

himself. If he wasn't unconscious, he was at least to the point where he wasn't aware of what was going on. Anybody could have done anything with him.?

Grant says he contacted the Seattle police immediately after the body's discovery, not surprisingly, he was received coolly. There's a body there and a shotgun and what they think is a suicide note, so it's real easy to jump to that conclusion." he says. "It also makes their job a lot easier. In fact, they were upset that the homicide guys told me. You know, we wouldn't even be on this thing if it wasn't Kurt Cobain." The stuff they fed the press about how they investigated it as a possible homicide is total bullshit. This was never looked at as a possible homicide."

He attributes their reluctance to investigate further to both human nature and manipulation on Love's part. The missing-persons report phoned in by Love (for which she claimed to be Cobain's mother: Wendy O'Convor) was ambiguously worded to suggest that Cobain had purchased the shotgun after he fled the rehab center (although a receipt found as the scene confirms that he bought the shotgun before he left Seartle for Marina del Rey). And she continuelly stressed to the police, the public and anyone else who would listen that her husband was suicidal.

Grant's concern about the "copycal" suicides committed by misinformed Nirvana fans spurred him to go public with his claims on December 13, 1994, in an interview on the "The Sil Gross Show," which is syndicated to 175 stations by CBS Radio. Love's lavgers learned of Grant's scheduled appearance when Gross promoted the interview on the show a few days before it took place. They called and warned us that we better not do it." says the show's producer. Greg Cockrell. "They made clear there would be legal action. Gill said, "bo shoad, we're doing it anyway."

Except for requesting a tape of the show, Gross never heard back from Camp Courtney. Her lawyers, however, did succeed in gaining a public apology from "The Torn Leylos Show," a radio program synclicated by Westwood One

Entertainment to 116 stations, after they ranan interview with Grant on January 5, 1995.

Love's attorneys also filed a complaim with the California Department of Consumer Affairs in an attempt to revoke Grant's investigator's license. Grant recently applied for and received a renewal of it.

"They are making an allout effort to score everybody away," says Grant. "Of course, they're blowing smoke. Anything they would do would just bring more attention to the case, and that's exactly what they want to avoid."

Conversely, that's exactly what Grant is trying to encourage. Though he's been accused of being a profit-morivated publicity-monger, Grant says his aim is true. He contitives to compile information, hoping to build a strong enough argument to compet the Seattle police to reopen the case. They -.



Hank Harrison. Courtney Love's father, doesn's father, doesn's father, doesn's father and the media as Love's deadbeat dad. Harrison wants to set the record straight about his life with Courtney.

While most accounts contend Harrison has had little contact with Country after his marnage to her mother. Linda Carroll, broke up when she was five years old, he tells a different story. 'I was with her from the day she was born until the time she was side either every, weekend or every day.' he explains from somewhere in Nonhern California. 'Then they went to Oregon and she was adopted out from under me. I didn't have any contact with her until she was fifteen, when I got her out of juvenile ball and she came to live with me. Courtney had been sent to live in suvenile hall (reform school) for shoplifting. Herrison Delieves that's where she picked up a particularly bad habit. She softched me off a couple of times to the cops for having gress in the house."

Love's words about her father are equally unided. She claims that she was conceived on a date rape, and was given LSD and beaten by her father. A observioncer at the dawn of the Silicon Valley microcomputer revolution, Harrison took the job as editor of Doctor Dobb's Journal and would go on to hold positions at InfoWorld and A Plus magazines. These accomplishments did nor impress Countney. She decorated her room in the 1870 Victorian with dozens of hit candles. "If you're a lincoln or a Peters and you call for the cops, you might as well forget about it." she says. "If you're a Britton, they'll be right there." The sheriff's department denies all accusations of unequal enforcement.

Pickett fears that gang culture is beginning to affect the reservation. "Byron wore a red rag and Nell wore a blue ray, Local kids go to juvenile hall and come back with stupid ideas." Gang insignies appear spray-painted on reservation walls.

Violence broke out again at Round Valley when Elvin "Pink" Peters, Leonard's brosher, was shot and injured on October 13. There were no arrests. Then, on November 7. Mendocino deputies seized riffes and shorgute from the Lincoln and Peters kin after Donna and flarold Britton, brother of Gene, had their house fired on. Claudia Britton, Gene's widow, reported being fired on as her son drove her to her brother-in-law's house to evacuace her children. The Sante Rosa Press Democrat reported that a nearby day-care center was caught in the crossfire and hit with buliets. Edwina Lincoln was arrested for allegedly, shoving a deputy as her home was searched. Although the sheriff's department reported an exchange of fire between the Britton and Poters residences, no guns were confiscated from Brittons.

Meanwhile, the government's case against Bear Lincoln is not going smoothiy. On November 30, Judge James Luther dismissed the grand jury indictment of Lincoln on the grounds that the prosecutor did not sufficiently inform the jury of inconsistencies in prior statements by deputy Dennis Miller, the key witness. In early statements to investigators, Miller said Lincoln fired from the darkness after Peters had approached the patrol car alone. But he told the grand jury that the two men approached the car together.

Nell Britton was the only civilian to testify before the grand Jury that indicted Bear Lincoln.

New charges were filed immediately after the indictment was dropped, and Lincoln remains in custody. Evidence on the new charges must be presented in a public hearing rather than a closed grand jury before the case spes to trial.

No living American writer has influenced rock n'roll songwriters more than William Burroughs. Of the stars who have paid homag to Burroughs, none made as strong an impression on him as Kurt Cobain. It therefore came as a surprise to the editors of HIGH TIME when on December 17, 1994, the magazine received a fax from a Seattle-based group. Triends Understanding Kurt," laving partial blame for Cobains death on the Master himsel

The gist of the charge was that in the last months of his life, Cobain acquired a device called the Dream Machine, which had been or ated by Burroughs' friend and collaborator Brion Gysin and popularized by Burroughs. The Dream Machine, the group wrote, is "a danger ous trance-inducing contraption," and there had been a "string of suicides associated with the machine since the '60s." Furthermore, they claimed, it was "in fact, the catalyst in Kurt's upbellevably tragic, untimely death. To this day Courtney ponders whether courses ou safet

The Dream Machine consists of a cardboard cylinder with holes in it attached to a record-player turntable, in the middle of which sits a 100-wart light bulb. When the machine is turned on, the odinder spins at 78 rpm. Subjects sit in front of the cylinder and close their eyes and the light reflects through the holes in the spinning attnder onto the evelids. The resulting flashes of light may, if the subjects are susceptible, create a mild sensation alon to the effect of the simplex light show. Aided by the inhalation of good por, the device might create at best a mild dreamlike sensation or at worst (unless you're prone to epileptic setzures) an even milder headachs. It's an adaptation of flicker rechnology, first seen with strobe lights and now packaged as brain machines.

Burroughs once said about the Dream Machine. Subjects report dazzling lights and uncerthly brilliance and culor_Elaborate geometric constructions of incredible intricacy build up from a multidimensional mosaic into living fireballs like the mandalas of Eastern Hysicism or resolve momentarily into apparently individual images and powerfully dramatic scenes like brightly colored creams."

Following up the same fax. SOM4 the San Francisco "journal of Left Coase culture." found Steve Newman, a representative of Friends Understanding Kurt, who elaimed Cobain had used the Dream Machine for "up to 72 hours at a time." Newman said the core of FUK was himself, Love Love's attorney Celeste Mitchell and other friends of Cobain's, as well as various peripheral members. Love he explained, played more of a "low-key role." HIGH TIMES efforts to contact FUK were unsuccessful. Interview requests made through Love's record company, Geffen, and publicity agency, PMK about this subject, were not answered. An attempt to acquire photos taken during Cobain's visit to Burroughs' home in Lawrence, KS in 1993-that had been given to Roservary Carroll, Love's principal attorney-also didn't merá a return cal

However, we did locate David Woodard, the San Francisco businessmen who manufactures and sells replicas of 6ysin and Burroughs' Dream Machine for \$145. In an interview conducted by Victor Bockris for HIGH TIMES, Woodard contended that Cobain called him as many as 20 times over a period of six months during 1993 and 1994 to talk about his life and the Dream Machine. 'I got the sense that he was using it for long periods but 72 hours? That's ludicrous."

Woodard met Cobain at a party in Seattle in the summer of 1993. He prefers not to

detail the specifics of how and when Kurr bought the machine. According to the FUK fax. Woodard honorably complied with Kurr's very sincere wish, promptly and professionally shipping a freshly minted machine to Madrone (Seattle): The state of California does not prohibit the sale of this fancy death machine to desperate young millionaires."

Surprisingly. Woodard admits that the Dream Machine may have compounded Cobain's problems. "If enything," he says, "the Dream Machine helped him to see that he was beginning to fall apart as a cultural figure. He felt like Andy Warhol Wagner and Satan rolled up into one. He was in a very special place which invited simely suicide. If seemed like it was the perfect decision."

Does Woodard concede that the device he sold Cobain contributed to his death? "I pictured the suicide as being informed by an inner voice which was made audible through his experiences with the Oream Machine," he explains. "Yes, the Dream Hachine played a part."

The controversy over what effect a psychedelic light machine had on Kurt Cobain during the last days of his life may be a smokescreen that plays into the hands of those who would have us believe he took his life two years ago. Tom Grant calls the FUK fax a "confusion tacht" and "a futile effort to throw a blanket of deception over the truth." He clearly believes Friends Understanding Kunt is Courtney Love.

Hopefully, this article will stimulate discussion and lead to more revelations from those who really know when happened to Kurt Cobain and why he is no longer with us in

Book details murder theories in the death of Nirvana leader

Allegations that Kurt Cobain was murdered have been exhumed again.

Monday, Montreal radio station CHOM-FM broadcast the first of a four-part "world exclusive" based on a forthcoming book by two Montreal journalists, Ian Halperin and Max Wallace. Culling information from 200 interviews in Seattle and Los Angeles over the last 16 months, Halperin claims his book will give "a very good idea of who (killed Cobain)," and that his widow, Courtney Love, may have been involved.

The most inflammatory sources include Tom Grant, the private investigator originally hired by Love to find the missing Cobain in the days immediately preceding his death; Seattle coroner Dr. Nikolas Carlson, Hartshome; Dylan Cobain's best friend; and a man named Il Duce, who claims Love offered him \$50,000 U.S. to murder Cobain just days before he was found dead of what was ruled a selfinflicted shotgun wound. Cobain died on April 5, 1994, and was found on April 8.

Halperin and Wallace have completed the book and say they have a U.S. publisher for it, whose name Halperin would not reveal yesterday. Wallace is in Los Angeles, where he is conducting an interview with tabloid-news show Hard Copy to be broadcast tomorrow on NBC.

Halperin claims sources in the Seattle police department have indicated they will reopen the case and file murder-conspiracy charges against someone within a week.

His involvement with the story began in July 94.

Helperin, a former winner of Rolling Stone's college journalism award and a saxophonist, was tour-

ing with his band. While in Seattle, he heard the well-circulated rumor that Cobain had been murdered.

At first skeptical, he began to talk to people connected to Cobain, including Carlson, Cobain's best friend and also a friend of Halperin. "The journalistic instinct took over," and he and Wallace commenced the months of interviews that make up the forthcoming book.

They have more than 100 hours of videotaped sessions. Grant is the main theorist that Love was involved. Halperin said II Duce, a singer in a metal band called the Mentors, has "passed a polygraph" with his accusation that Love tried to buy his services as a hit man.

"We also have Courtney's father, Hank Harrison, accusing his own daughter of murder," Halperin said.

The story gets even more conspiratorial. Murder allegations include Hole bassist Kristan Pfail, who overdosed on heroin just two months after Cobain's death, and the shooting of Seattle police officer Antonio Terry, whose name was on the missing persons report filed when Cobain disappeared in April '94.

Halperin was careful to say he's "not accusing anyone of murder. I just want the case reopened to stop the copy-cat suicides, which are still going on."

Halperin was co-author of a series of controversial articles in the Concordia student newspaper in 1983-84 criticising the university's athletic department and its then-director. A \$100,000 libel suit was settled out of court. Also, a charge of purjury against Halperin was thrown out by a Quebec Court judge in 1990.

I told him that If Briggs had knowledge of a crime that took place in LA, he would have to report it to the police in LA. I explained to him that we have no jurisdiction in LA. He said that Halperin told him that he had sources in the Seattle Police Department.

This is a tape taken by "SKT" of a phone conversation he had today with a guy who identified himself as JACK RIGGS. I believe Riggs is the one who contacted Ritter about two weeks ago and told Ritter he had broken the Kurt Cobain murder.

I had a message on my voice mail yesterday from a guy who identified himself as Jack Riggs and he left basically the same message. He, Riggs, had broken the Cobain murder case because "EL DOUCHE" had passed the polygraph test. Not knowing who EL DOUCHE was I left a message with Kirkland that I would contact this Riggs today at the number he left me (310) 374-5266. Since he had talked with SKI today I didn't bother to call.

Ila was able to transcribe a really bad tape of the conversation between Briggs and Ski which I have attached to this memo. They have me in "WARM & FUZZY SCHOOL" so I won't be able to do it. Anyway here are some things I would like you to do.

1. Contact this Briggs and tell him we are interested in his information.

2. Advise him we are looking forward to working with the Los Angeles Police Department on this joint investigation.

a. This conspiracy originated in Los Angeles and is L.A.P.D. jurisdiction.

b. For the most part all the players are either in L.A. or rotate through there on a regular basis.

c. The polygraph operator etc. is also an L.A. resident.

3. Have him contact us with the name of the L.A. P.D. detective handling the investigation down there and their case number. (I guess it could be L.A. Sheriff's Office also but you get the point.)

4. Request copies of any statements he has generated in his year long investigation and a copy of the polygraph chart and the questions asked during the test.

The point we have to make is we will cooperate with him but L.A. authorities obviously have to get involved. If you think of something else go for it.

If Briggs agrees to send us any of the above you can have him send it to me or yourself. I will be out of school Friday and we can go from there.

I don't think this guy is going to go away and as I said before if you listen to the tape he doesn't sound like a "220." I think if we don't approach him with an positive attitude he is going to bite us in the ass. It will be interesting to see if he does go to the local cops!

As you are aware the suicide of Kurt Cobain has once again become a media issue. Allegations by a California private investigator, Tom Grant, have rekindled the concerns of Courtney Love over the preservation/security of the crime scene photos. Grant is alledging Courtney was responsible for her husbands death and we covered up the murder. Because of the rekindled media interest in her husbands suicide Courtney Love has gone to her attorney with concerns over the release of any of the crime scene photos. Courtneys attorney, Seth Lichtenstein called and asked if the photos could be destroyed to prevent any mistaken release .

I have advised Mr. Lichtenstein the 35 mm film had not been developed nor would it unless it became necessary. The polaroids are in evidence under lock and key and only three people are authorized to remove them from evidence. I am not sure Mr. Lichtenstein is satisfied with this but I explained with Grant still running amuck we would look foolish and certainly unprofessional if we destroyed the only photographs of the crime scene.Mr. Lichtenstein may go higher on the chain of command so I thought I had better let you know.

I have declined the case for the following reasons:

- XThere is insufficient evidence of a crime to file this case.I need additional investigation of information (see comments below).
- _____ While there is sufficient evidence of a crime, the facts of this case do not justify filing criminal charges.

____ Other reasons (see comments below).

Comments:

After reviewing this case with Ted Inkley, Director of the Criminal Division, we have decided not to file charges. In order to prove an assault, the City must prove that the defendant intentionally assaulted the victim causing bodily injury. We must also prove the absence of self defense. We are unable to prove these elements for several reasons.

First, the victim, Ms. Cobain, will testify that nothing happened, contrary to the police report. Additionally, the 911 tape is probably not admissible because it neither describes an assault nor do her hearsay statements fall under an exception to the hearsay rule. Most notably, her statements do not fall under the excited utterance exception

because her speech gives no indication that she was under the stress of a startling event such as an assault. She is not crying on the tape, nor is she yelling or speaking quickly. Also, she explained her injury to the officers on the scene as being self-inflicted. Thus, Ms. Cobain's testimony, her statements to the police and her statements to the 911 operator would not assist in proving an assault.

Second, the independent witness did not see the beginning of the altercation because it occurred in the kitchen. She only saw the end of the scuffle when it moved into the hallway. This, in conjunction with Ms. Cobain's testimony, makes it unlikely that we can disprove a self-defense claim.

Thus, we are unable to prove that an assault causing bodily injury occurred and that there was an absence of self defense. As such, the City declines to file charges.

Inside ${\tt I}$ found a Washington state driver's license in the name of Cobain, Kurt Donald DOB/022067. I had called for 1G, Sgt. Getchman enroute to the call, and Sgt. Getchman and A/Sgt. Fewel arrived. I used Getchman's polaroid to photograph the scene, while Fewel and Getchman used 35mm cameras to document the scene. Lt. Zimnisky arrived, and notified Homicide. Lt. Marberg stated his Detectives would respond. I maintained the scene until Homicide's arrival.

On a nearby table was a paper placemat, with a hand-written note in red ink. The pen was stabbed into the note, holding it in place. The note was apparently written by Cobain to bis wife and daughter, explaining why he had killed himself. I stayed on scene, until relieved by second watch patrol units, after Cobain's body had been removed by the M.E.

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I secured Cobain's main house, and responded to the Homicide office to prepare the major report and this statement.

As an addendum, I had been dispatched to the Cobain residence within the last month, to respond to a 911 hang-up call. On arrival I had contacted Courtney Love, Cobain's wife, who had stated she had called 911 because she was depressed. I saw no signs of injury to Love. I heard a small child's voice, and asked who was caring for the child. Love replied, "my husband-he's in the next room." I knocked on an adjoining room's door, and Kurt Cobain answered the door. Cobain had just recently recovered from a substance abuse induced coma in Rome. I asked Kurt what was going on, and he stated that there was a lot of stress in their relationship currently. Cobain stated that they should probably seek counseling, and I advised him to do that. There was no apparent need for police intervention, and with Love and Cobain's assurances that they'd work thing out, I left the residence. End of statement,

10. One fired Winchester, AA, 20 gauge, 2-1/2 inch shotshell.

Results of Examination:

The item 8 Remington shotgun was empty (not loaded) when received. The shotgun was successfully test fired and found to be functioning in a normal manner. The trigger pull was determined to be approximately 3.6 to 3.8 pounds.

The shotgun's two-round magazine, plus one round in the chamber, give it a total capacity of three rounds. A functional crossbolt safety is located to the rear of the trigger. This safety was in the "OFF" position when the shotgun was received.

The shotgun's barrel is 22 inches in length, and is fitted with a compensator at the muzzle for a total overall firearm length of 45-5/8 inches.

The item 10 fired shotshell was determined to have been fired in the item 8 Remington shotgun bearing serial number 1088925. This shotshell has markings indicating its original load consisted of 7/8 ounce of number 8 shot.

SUBJECT Firearms Fingerprinting and Examination Problems

The Washington State Crime Laboratory Firearms Examiners will not examine or test fire any firearm previously processed for fingerprints with Rhodamine 6G. Rhodamine 6G is a chemical used in conjunction with the super glue or alternate light source process by fingerprint technicians.

Rhodamine 6G is a carcinogenic and the firearms examiners will not handle any weapons processed with Rhodamine 6G unless the weapon has been thoroughly cleaned. Unfortunately, the cleaning process is so severe it could alter the weapons characteristics and/or cause the examiner other problems which would render him unable to give an exact test result.

If you are going to process a weapon for fingerprints and then forward the weapon to the Washington State Crime Laboratory for firearms examination, advise the ID Unit and they will use chemicals in their process acceptable to the Washington State Crime Laboratory.



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

Inside the jacket pocket is a receipt for the purchase of the Remington 20 gauge shotgun serial #1088925. The purchase price was \$308.37 and the receipt is dated 3-30-94. The purchaser was Dylan R. Carlson, 2210 NE 92nd #304, Seattle 98115, from Stan Baker Sports, 10000 Lake City Way NE, 522-4575. There. does not seem to be any other evidence of trauma. The ambiant . temperature at 1115 is 61 degrees F and the body core temperature is the same. Dr. Hartshorne examines the contents of the victim's pockets and notes that there is \$63.00 in cash and a piece of note paper with "Seattle Guns, 145 & Lake City written on it. In the left front pant pocket there was an address book, miscellaneous papers, and another note paper which read "Remington 20 gauge, 2 3/4 shells or shorter, set up for light shot, 10888925. Also in the pants pocket was a copy of a Delta plane ticket, #788F, dated 4/1/94, seat 2F, in the name of Cobain/Kurt. The victim was noted as wearing a long sleeve shirt open, a T-shirt with two figures on it & "half Japanese" lettered on it, blue jeans, and a pair of black athletic shoes. The victim is then removed by the KCME for autopsy. All the contents of the victim's clothing will be taken by the KCME and all other items retained by Detectives. There was an open window on the residence and Patrol Officers checked the interior of the home and found that it had not been disturbed. Allen Draher, 386-5880, Cobain's attorney; and Lee Johnson, Cobain's agent, responded to the scene and met with Draher was advised that the residence would be Capt. Farrar. Detectives secured the scene at 1155. turned over to him. Patrol Officers remained at the scene to handle the crowd and to protect the residence until arrangements could be made by Draher. NCIDENT DESCRIPTION:

On 4-8-94 at approximately 0845 hours the body of Kurt Donald Cobain was found in the garage loft of the residence at 171-Lake Washington Blvd. East. Cobain (the lead singer for the rock group Nirvana) was observed lying on the floor of the loft with a shotgun on his chest by electricians working on the property. The electricians summoned police and fire who forced entry into the loft.

Cobain suffered a single GSW to the head. The shotgun had been placed in Cobains mouth and discharged. There were marks on Cobains hands consistant with the firing of this weapon. Cobain has been dead for several days.

Cobain has been positively identified through fingerprints.

The 20 ga. shotgun found on Cobains chest has been traced to a gun shop in the North End and sale to Cobain and a friend has been confirmed.


A lengthy suicide note was found in the loft near the body.

At this point in the investigation it appears the fatal wound to Cobain is self-inflicted.

Captain Larry Farrar responded to the crime scene.

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
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
